Attached for your review is a copy of the January 2018 monthly Fire Department response statistics to be included in the Fire Marshal's report to the Public Safety Committee.

Be advised the Township Fire Companies are in the midst of migrating to a new reporting software. The software was found to be significantly easier for companies to use and navigate. The contract cost is also lower than the previous provider. While the transition is taking and use issues ironed out some information may not be included in the report. The information will be updated at a future date.

As time permits future report formats will also be modified to also track response goals as well as other significant and pertinent statistical run information.

Summary of Significant Incidents

- 1/2 and 1/18 Numerous township apparatus responded to two separate three alarm fires in neighboring municipalities on different dates. One fire location was a car dealership and the other location was a hirese apartment building. Apparatus is automatically dispatched based on the needed resource type and travel distance to the location. The same applies when additional resources are needed within Cheltenham. This system of automatic aid ensures no one municipality has to try and provide all the resources that may on occasion be needed at a major event. Additionally some stations are automatically "backfilled" by other companies so no area is depleted of its protection.
- 1/5 12:57PM Limekiln Pike; Hirese Apartment. Companies were dispatched to an apartment fire on the 8TH floor of a 15 Story Hirise. The fire was located in a middle bedroom of the unit and quickly extinguished. The apartment residents had escaped the fire and closed the door behind them confining the smoke to the apartment. The unit suffered fire damage to the bedroom and smoke damage throughout. All other units were permitted to reoccupy after smoke was ventilated.
- 1/17 4:20PM Green Bhar Rd; Dwelling Fire. Companies arrived at a reported trash can on fire in a house to find heavy smoke issuing from the roof and front of the dwelling and fire issuing from the first floor windows in the rear. The arriving engine company crew quickly extinguish the bulk of the fire with a hose line stretched through the front door. Companies were on scene for an extended period checking for extension into concealed spaces and ventilating smoke and heat. The sole occupant at the time of the fire escaped uninjured. A pet dog succumbed to the smoke. The house suffered extensive fire and smoke damage.
- 1/25 2:14PM Ashbourne Road; Dwelling fire. A passer-by reported unusually heavy smoke coming from a chimney. In many instances the cause is start up of a wood stove or improper heater operation. In this instance a build-up of creosote and soot, (both combustible), within the chimney flue was burning. The occupants were unaware of any problem. Upon further investigation smoke was found in the second floor and attic of the dwelling. This is an indication the chimney is compromised. Pulling walls and using a thermal imager companies located fire in a second floor wall. The dwelling was almost 100 years old. The chimney mortar and flue had failed allowing the burning contents of the flue to ignite wood framing inside the walls. The fire in the walls was extinguished. The stubborn fire within the chimney flue was extinguished using a nozzle specially designed for such fires.

Attached please find our Operational Report for the month of February 2018. Our financial, detail, and statistical report for the month of January 2018 are also attached.

I attended the Journal of Emergency Medicine (JEMS) conference in Charlotte, North Carolina. I was a member of the faculty speaking about Motorcycle Medics. I attended several excellent seminars on EMS operations and management.

I worked with the Nearest Ambulance Committee during the month. The Committee gave their approval to Montgomery County to move forward with the nearest ambulance being sent to the most serious calls regardless of jurisdiction. Due to equipment and technical changes, the implementation may not take place until early summer.

Our engineers have worked with our ambulance rebuilders to revise the specifications for our remounted ambulance. They expect to have an on-site meeting during March to finalize the specifications.

The Joint County Radio Committee met during the month to address changes to Montgomery County's Fire and EMS radio dispatch procedures and radio usage in general. Changes will be forthcoming by the close of 2018.
