

The regular meeting of the Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) was held tonight. Members present were Lorna Rosenberg, Yuri Berg and Linda Foggie. Ex-officio members present were Tom McHugh, Earl Stamm, Diane Diffenderfer, Kurt Ahrens and Robin Eismen. Guests present were Julie Slavet, Doryan De Angel, Bonnie Hay and Donna Powell. Township Liaison present was Nancy K. Gibson, Public Information Officer. (See attached attendance sheet.)

1. **Call to Order** – Ms. Rosenberg called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m.
2. Everyone introduced themselves, including new EAC members Yuri Berg and Linda Foggie. Ms. Rosenberg expressed concerned that two EAC voting positions were left vacant even though more than enough candidates applied. She also thought the EAC deserved input on member selection. Mr. McHugh noted that the EAC had endorsed him as a member when a position became available in 2013. He was not sure if he would continue his contributions to the EAC if they were not appreciated. Ms. Rosenberg wanted to know the criteria used for citizen committee appointments.
3. **Acceptance of Meeting Minutes** – Ms. Rosenberg made a motion to accept the December 16, 2013 meeting minutes; seconded by Ms. Foggie. The motion was unanimously approved.
4. **Committee Reports:**
  - A. *Communications Committee* – No member was present to give a report. However, Ms. Gibson stated that she had updated the EAC and Sustainable Cheltenham web pages, which now include the Sustainability Pledge and a Resources List. Members can always suggest changes and provide additional resources, which should include a brief description for the users' convenience. Mr. Stamm said he wanted to discuss ideas for the website with Ms. Gibson.
  - B. *Water and Ecology Committee* – Ms. Duffy was not present to give her report (see attached).

C. *Energy and Emissions Committee* – Mr. McHugh reported the committee had not met due to the holidays.

D. *School Board Liaison* – Ms. Rosenberg submitted her report (see attached). She indicated that she sent a letter to Cheltenham High School Principal Kuhn to support a student petition to increase recycling at the high school (see attached).

E. Ms. Rosenberg described the EAC's four-committee setup and invited anyone not on a committee to select one. Ms. Foggie and Ms. Diffenderfer chose the School Liaison Committee. Mr. Berg and Mr. Stamm chose Energy and Emissions. Ms. De Angel chose Water and Ecology. All committees were reminded to send any news items appropriate for the EAC newsletter to EAC member Martin Carey at [Martin@SustainableCheltenham.org](mailto:Martin@SustainableCheltenham.org).

**5. Old Business:**

A. *Super Wawa Zoning Hearing Appeal* – Mr. Stamm reported the he and Ms. Rosenberg were prevented from presenting EAC input about the appeal to the Zoning Hearing Board (ZHB) because the EAC did not have “standing.” However, on January 15, 2014, the Public Works Committee authorized the EAC to submit their input. But the ZHB has final discretion on whether or not to permit EAC members to speak or just submit their written report. Mr. Stamm urged members to attend the ZHB meeting on the appeal on Tuesday, February 18 at 7:00 p.m. at Curtis Hall. The Public Works Committee also asked Township Staff to develop a procedure on how Township citizen committees can advise other committees and design a flow chart showing the development review process. Several members indicated the EAC should have an opportunity for input in development decisions since Sustainable Development is one of the ten goals of the Township's Sustainability Plan.

B. *Sustainability Award and Festival* – Ms. Gibson drafted a webpage outlining Sustainability Awards. Residents, businesses, institutions and other stakeholders in Cheltenham

Township will be eligible, and their endeavors must benefit the Township. The nomination deadline is April 25. Winners will be selected by the EAC and recognized at a Board of Commissioners meeting in addition to Arts in the Park (AIP). The new awards will be advertised via press releases, website, cable channels and the Township newsletter.

Ms. Rosenberg reported that “Arts in the Park featuring Sustainable Cheltenham” is confirmed for this year. (See attached.) The Sustainable Cheltenham portion will likely be situated in the High School Park meadow area. AIP organizers have requested that the EAC find a major sponsor, such as a car dealership or utility, and provided the AIP sponsorship. Former EAC member Jonathon Essoka had previously agreed to contact area banks. Ms. Slavet suggested contacting political campaigns and the Sustainability Business Network. All vendors must pay AIP vendor fees for tables at the event. Ms. Rosenberg will coordinate with Cheltenham School District for student participation. AIP organizers also want the EAC to introduce activities for 8 to 13 year olds. Ideas included a treasure hunt or geocaching, mosaic or trash art, or possibly a trailer featuring a fun green-themed activity.

*C. Municipal Action Plan* – Ms. Rosenberg advised Mr. McHugh that last month the EAC asked the Energy and Emissions Committee to review the Township 2014 capital budget to identify projects that could have sustainability implications. Mr. Berg volunteered to undertake the review.

#### **6. New Business:**

A. Julie Slavet, Executive Director of the Tookany/Tacony-Frankford Watershed Partnership, Inc. (TTF), described some of the history and projects of the organization. About half of the watershed is located in Philadelphia and the rest is in Montgomery County. Philadelphia is working on an ambitious 25-year plan to correct the problem that 60% of its

sewage ends up in the storm sewer system. Upstream Cheltenham contains a major portion of the watershed, and its residents value the creek.

TTF has initiated a partnership with GreenTreks Network to develop a website focused on the stormwater resources of all upstream watershed communities at no cost to the municipalities. This new website will be similar to the one developed for Wissahickon communities at <http://stormwaterpa.org/wissahickon.html>. Ms. Slavet asked EAC members to attend a meeting with the GreenTreks representatives to help design this website. After discussion, a meeting time of 6:00 p.m. before the next EAC meeting on February 24 was considered the best option at either the Elkins Park or Jenkintown Libraries. Ms. Slavet will also invite representatives from the other watershed communities.

Ms. Slavet also promoted The Circuit Trails Campaign, which aims to secure \$10 million for trail planning, design and construction from the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission to keep building out The Circuit, a proposed 750-mile bicycle and pedestrian trail connecting the Greater Philadelphia region. Mr. McHugh lauded the idea of a bicycle trail through Cheltenham.

B. Ms. Gibson circulated copies of two ads featuring cleaner-water tips on winter de-icing and home landscaping for publication in local papers to satisfy the Township's MS4 requirements. Mr. Ahrens recommended adding the Township website address, but both ads already featured the website at the bottom.

## **7. Announcements:**

A. The Cheltenham EAC will be featured in the upcoming *Pennsylvania Environmental Council Handbook*.

B. TTF will host an information and networking breakfast on Tuesday, February 11 from 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. at Globe Dye Works, 4500 Worth Street in Philadelphia.

C. Meetings seeking public input for the Township's proposed new Zoning Ordinance begin this Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. at Glenside Hall. Additional meetings are scheduled on February 26, March 26 and April 23 at the same time and place.

D. Ms. Foggie received notice about the proposed development of a 146-unit mid-rise at 1900 Ashbourne Road located between the School Administration Building and Elkins Park Post Office. The matter is on tonight's Planning Commission meeting agenda. Mr. Stamm volunteered to research the matter.

8. **Adjournment** – Ms. Rosenberg made a motion to adjourn the meeting; seconded by Ms. Foggie. The motion was unanimously approved. The meeting adjourned at 9:40 p.m.



- FHSP expressed concern about distracting visitors/customers of not entering the park if we have too much going on outside the park, if the SC Festival is on Montgomery and High School Road
- FHSP would like to locate our tables in the meadow, they are going to eliminate the hayride, so there should be plenty of space for tables
  - I will inquire if we will/can have an overhead covered area as it might be hot or drizzly
- FHSP has determined that any for-profit business we invite must be a sponsor and sign up as a vendor. This event is the major fundraiser for the part and weather you are selling jewelry, trivets or solar panels, you must pay for a booth. The sponsor form you must use is attached.
- Non-profits and the schools and township will have free tables and exhibit space. ( I don't know yet about the cost of those tables or who will pay for them)

- FHSP gains a lot of support from volunteers to help vendors with set up and break down of booths and materials. They would be very appreciative if we are in charge of all of our own tables and vendors.
- We should be strategic about how many vendors we solicit and think about strategic quality over quantity.
- If we are located in the back meadow, then EAC will probably not need to solicit donations
- FHSP said that there is a need for interesting activities for 8-13 year old kids
  - Suggested creating a geo-cacheing or treasure hunt activity using the Park as a backdrop
  - It might be possible to pair older kids with younger kids – we should think about this
  - Or get a group of high school students or Arcadia – maybe environmental education majors to create the geo-cache treasure hunt.
