



**WHEREAS**, Pennsylvania Labor and Industry has informed the Township that the Township is responsible for ADA Accessibility Plan Reviews and Inspections from October 1, 2010 onward; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township desires to use a third-party inspection agency to perform the required ADA Accessibility Plan Reviews and Inspections and that the building permit applicant be responsible to pay the ADA Accessibility Plan Review and Inspection Fees.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Cheltenham, County of Montgomery, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, that §A300-4. Building Construction. be amended by adding a new subsection (6), as follows:


- (6) The building permit fee for ADA Accessibility Plan Review and Inspection shall be as follows:
  - a. Accessibility Plan Reviewer and Inspector:
    - \$75.00 base fee plus \$0.07 per square foot of floor area or each fraction of affected floor area.
      1. Accessibility plan review is considered to be 20% of the above fee calculation with a minimum fee of \$15.00
      2. Accessibility Inspections are considered to be 80% of the above fee calculation with a minimum fee of \$65.00
      3. Where floor area cannot be applied (door relocations, etc.), only the minimum fee shall be charged.


This fee shall be in addition to all other applicable building permit fees.

10. The Board of Commissioners considered appointing a new energy supplier. Mr. Kraynik reported that the recommended supplier would also cover traffic lights, which will be an additional savings.

Upon motion of Mr. Haywood, the Board of Commissioners unanimously appointed Constellation NewEnergy, which was selected by the Pennsylvania League of Cities and Municipalities' Municipal Utility Alliance, as the Township's energy supplier for all electric accounts for a one year term, January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011.

11. Upon motion of Mr. Haywood, and unanimously approved by the Board of Commissioners, the Public Works Committee Regular Meeting Minutes dated November 10, 2010 were received.

12. Upon motion of Mr. Sharkey, the Board of Commissioners unanimously awarded a Professional Services Contract for the High School Park Meadow Restoration Project to Wells Appel, Inc. in the amount of \$23,450, being within budgetary limitations.

13. Upon motion of Mr. Sharkey, the Board of Commissioners unanimously awarded three (3) individual Construction Contracts for Phase III of the La Mott Housing Rehabilitation Program for the properties located at 1700 Chelsea Road in the amount of \$18,810; 1708 Chelsea Road in the amount of \$21,215; and 7437 Euston Street in the amount of \$24,999; to Premier Builders and Remodeling, 2030 N. Black Horse Pike, Williamstown, NJ 08094, being within budgetary limitations.

14. Upon motion of Mr. Sharkey, the Board of Commissioners unanimously awarded a Professional Services Contract for Preliminary Engineering Design Services for the Elkins Park West Commercial District Streetscape Improvement Project to Gannett Fleming, Inc. in the amount of \$64,500, being within budgetary limitations.

15. Upon motion of Mr. Sharkey, the Board of Commissioners unanimously adopted **Resolution No. 45-10** honoring Boy Scout Troop 7 on the occasion of its 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Said Resolution to be presented at the Troop's Annual Dinner on November 23, 2010.

16. Upon motion of Mr. Sharkey, and unanimously approved by the Board of Commissioners, the Public Affairs Committee Regular Meeting Minutes dated November 3, 2010 were received.

17. The Board of Commissioners considered the closure of the Police Administration Building (PAB) between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m.

There were comments from the public:

Olga McHugh, 127 Hewett Road, opposed the closure. She felt that it sends a terrible message; the PAB is a universal safe place especially at night; this is a poor way of saving money; she would rather pay to have the Cheltenham police available rather than have to call Eagleville; people will not call 911 for such calls as vandalism or a fight during the night hours; she questioned where prisoners would be taken and how they would be watched. She recently called about an illegally parked car, and Eagleville had so many questions, that most people will not want to be bothered. If she had called the Cheltenham police, they would have known exactly what she was talking about.

She was told that there will be a police officer staffing the building when prisoners are on the premises. This closure would allow extra police officers to be put on the street.

Mr. McKeown felt that Chief Norris would not recommend this if it would jeopardize the safety of the community. In response to a question from Ms. Hampton, Mr. Kraynik reported that the savings amounts to \$110,000.

Mrs. McHugh asked about savings. Mr. Simon told her that the salaries/benefits of two (2) dispatchers will be saved.

18. Upon motion of Mr. McKeown, the Board of Commissioners unanimously approved the closure of the Police Administration Building (PAB) between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m., effective February 1, 2011.

19. Upon motion of Mr. McKeown, and unanimously approved by the Board of Commissioners, the Public Safety Committee Regular Meeting Minutes dated November 3, 2010, were received.

20. Upon motion of Mr. Swavola, the Board of Commissioners unanimously awarded a Planning Assistance Contract with Montgomery County for the years 2011-2013 in the amounts of \$10,494 for 2011; \$10,674 for 2012; and \$10,554 for 2013.

21. Upon motion of Mr. Swavola, and unanimously approved by the Board of Commissioners, the Building and Zoning Committee Regular Meeting Minutes dated November 3, 2010 were received.

22. Upon review of the Pension Board Meeting Minutes, Mr. Haywood stated that the Township's pension plan advisor has recommended an asset allocation mix for all four (4) plans and adding a commodity asset class, which will be another measure that will help the plans hedge against inflation and will improve returns without increasing risk.

23. Upon motion of Mr. Haywood, the Board of Commissioners unanimously approved the following asset allocation mix for all four (4) of the Township's Pension Plans as follows:

25. Upon motion of Mr. Swavola, the Board of Commissioners approved the request of Lady Savage, 8324 Fenton Road, Laverock, to pay the 2010 Township Real Estate Tax Bill in the amount of \$2,724.00 with no penalty (AYES: Hampton, Haywood, Portner, Sharkey Simon, Swavola; NAYES: McKeown).

26. Upon motion of Mr. Swavola, the Board of Commissioners unanimously adopted **Ordinance No. 2210-10** approving the following transfers within the 2010 Operating Budget.

**RESOLUTION NO. 47-10**

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF A  
TAX COLLECTOR FOR THE COLLECTION OF EARNED INCOME  
AND NET PROFIT TAXES LEVIED BY CHELTENHAM TOWNSHIP**

WHEREAS, PA Act 511 of 1965, the "Local Tax Enabling Act" permits municipalities within the Commonwealth to levy local taxes including a tax on earned income and net profits; and

WHEREAS, in 1991, the Board of Commissioners enacted the "Cheltenham Township Earned Income Tax Ordinance", levying a tax on earned income and net profits on residents and non-residents of Cheltenham Township; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania Act 32 of 2008 required the creation of a single earned income tax collection district and appointment of a single tax collector in each county of the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Tax Collection Committee conducted a thorough and competitive selection process to appoint an Earned Income Tax Collector for the municipalities in Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Tax Collection Committee selected Berkheimer Tax Administrator as the County-wide Earned Income Tax Collector on September 7, 2010; and

WHEREAS, PA Act 31 requires Pennsylvania municipalities to utilize the single earned income tax collector effective January 1, 2012, however, there is an option to utilize the County-wide tax collector as early as January 1, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Cheltenham Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, that Berkheimer Tax Administrator be appointed as the Earned Income and Net Profit Tax Collector for Cheltenham Township, Montgomery County, effective January 1, 2011, to be compensated at a rate of One and Thirty-Nine Hundreds Percent (1.39%) of the taxes collected.

30. Upon motion of Mr. Swavola, and unanimously approved by the Board of Commissioners, the Finance Committee Regular Meeting Minutes dated November 10, 2010 were received.

31. Under New Business:

a. Upon motion of Mr. Portner, the Board of Commissioners unanimously adopted the Preliminary Operating Budget for 2011 as per the November 3, 2010 Budget Message and incorporating recommendations in Item #3 of the Township Manager's November 10, 2010 memorandum.

b. Upon motion of Mr. Portner, the Board of Commissioners unanimously adopted the Preliminary Capital Budget for 2011 as per the November 3, 2010 Budget Message

Mr. Simon announced that the final budgets will be adopted at the Board of Commissioners meeting on December 22, 2010 and copies of the Preliminary Budget and are available at the Township Building.

c. Mr. Simon reviewed certain changes to the December 2010 meeting schedule as follows:

- There are no meetings on the first Wednesday, December 1, 2010, due to Chanukah.
- The Public Affairs, Public Safety and Building and Zoning Committee meetings will be held on the second Wednesday, December 8, 2010, at Curtis Hall.
- The Finance Committee and Public Works Committee meetings will be held on the third Wednesday, December 15, 2010, at the Township Building.
- The Board of Commissioners' meeting and budget adoption will be held on the fourth Wednesday, December 22, 2010, at Curtis Hall.

32. Under Citizens' Forum:

a. Robert DeMaria, 65 Limekiln Pike, expressed opinions on the following, and he distributed an outline of his concerns: he questioned the Township's tax rate, which is higher than other communities; the City of Philadelphia's tax system compared to the Township's; his perception that people who work in Philadelphia do not pay Cheltenham Earned Income Tax; property assessments; the amount of Sheriff sales and foreclosures compared to other

communities, which are affecting seniors; what he perceived as an inequitable tax rate between residential properties and non-residential properties; and risky bond issues.

Mr. Swavola stated that Cheltenham does not have the industrial and commercial base other communities have. Decisions made many years and generations ago decided to make it a primarily residential community, and today's residents are now bearing the burden for such a decision.

Mr. Simon stated that the Township has a lot of open space and tax-exempt properties that do not pay taxes, and therefore, have a significant impact on revenue. Mr. Simon stated that the bulk of every resident's tax bill is comprised of the School District's taxes, and the Township Commissioners have no control over the School District's budget.

Mr. DeMaria stated that he did not come to the meeting to debate the solutions but to get the reasons. Cost-cutting was not the answer because, in his opinion many residents do not pay taxes. He referred to Mr. Simon as a 'grown man' who should know better.

Mr. McKeown stated that the School District's tax bill comprises about 80% of a resident's total tax bill. The Commissioners cannot control the way the School District operates. Most residents are unhappy with the School District's taxes.

Mr. Haywood responded. It was his opinion that the reasons outlined by the Commissioners are a correct summary of the issues. He felt it was inappropriate for the Commissioners to take so much time on this matter. He took exception to Mr. DeMaria's reference to Mr. Simon as a 'grown man' and felt it was an inappropriate insult, and saw no point to further discussion.


b. Thomas McHugh, 127 Hewett Road, a long-time resident, felt that there is a balancing act to weigh the quality of life with the taxes. He suggested that the Commissioners who are liaisons with the School board needed to be proactive. He opposed the closure of the PAB as discussed this evening. He asked how savings would be achieved. He was told that for the PAB to remain open, two (2) civilians would have to be hired at a cost of \$110,000, including salaries and benefits. Current dispatchers were reassigned to clerical work.

c. Joseph Lewis, 1408 Wistar Drive, discussed the following: he noted that at a recent community meeting, residents were told that all of the other Township's are following the same cost-savings as Cheltenham by closing their PAB during evening hours, and when he questioned the affect of service to the community, the response was very positive; residents have concerns about a certain Pawn Shop near Shoppers Lane. He asked to be provided with information on the ownership of the shop, its license, the ownership of the shopping center, and asked if Pawn Shops can be regulated since it appears that only Cheltenham and Norristown Borough have pawn shops; he opposed the billboard at the intersection of Rt. 309 and Ogontz Avenue advertising casinos,

felt it was distasteful, and projected a bad image for children. He was told that there may be landscaping and fencing in accordance with a land development plan.

Mr. Bagley will review the agreement between the owner and the Township to determine if the Township can control what goes on the billboard. Regarding the pawn shop, Mr. Bagley advised that they cannot be zoned out, neither can adult businesses be zoned out but they can be regulated and restricted.

There being no further business, upon motion of Mr. Portner, and unanimously approved by the Board of Commissioners, the meeting was adjourned.
