

The regular meeting of the Economic Development Task Force (EDTF) was held tonight.

Members present were: Alan Cohen, David Kratzer, Dwight Pedro Lewis, Kenneth Mirsky, Brad Pransky and Diane Williams. Staff present were: Ruth Littner Shaw, Main Street Manager and Bryan T. Havir, Assistant Township Manager. Ex-officio member was Jonathan Essoka. Guests were Drusilla Buscemi and Zoe Rose.

1. ***Call to Order.*** Chairman Alan Cohen called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m.
2. ***Approval of Minutes.*** Chairman Cohen announced that approval of the June 15, 2010 meeting minutes will be tabled to the September 21, 2010 meeting due to a lack of a quorum as well as the discussion of the April 22, 2010 minutes.

3. ***Main Street Committee Reports by Chairpersons:***

A. **Design** – Mr. Kratzer reported that seven design grant applications were received this month. (see attached report). At this time Mr. Pranksy joined the meeting, but there was still no quorum. However, since there were items that needed review and recommendation, the following items of business were approved by the consensus of those in attendance.

**DCGP #10-12, Pita Pocket, 482 Township Line Road, for a sign.** The Design Committee made the following recommendations: Add gooseneck exterior lighting above the sign; clean up the olive oil bottles. It was recommended to the EDTF approval of a COA of the proposed sign and the request for Design Challenge Grant funding in an amount of \$392.20. Upon motion by Mr. Cohen, the recommendation was unanimously accepted by the EDTF.

**DCGP #10-13, State Farm, 12 E. Glenside Avenue, for an awning sign.** The Design Committee made the following recommendations: Pending verification that the sign would be made of fabric and receipt of a second quotation, it was recommended to the EDTF approval of a COA of the proposed sign and the request for Design Challenge Grant funding. However, due to incomplete documentation, consideration of the application will be continued to the September meeting.

**DCGP #10-14, Humphreys, 100 S. Easton Road, for painting.** The Design Committee recommended approval to the EDTF of the application and request for Design Challenge Grant

funding in the amount of \$1,750. A motion was made by Mr. Cohen to approve the funding application which was unanimously accepted by the EDTF.

**DCGP #10-15, Stitchers' Dream, 219 S. Easton Road, for a sign.** The Design Committee made the following recommendations: Sign posts should be painted white with the ball caps in gold. The Committee recommended that ground lighting be provided and the applicant agreed. Since lighting is an eligible category, the Committee recommended that this application for reimbursement of \$1,617.50 be encumbered and both the sign application and the lighting application be submitted together. The Design Committee recommended approval to the EDTF of a COA for the proposed sign, and consideration of the funding application will be continued to the September meeting.

**DCGP #10-16, The Blue Comet, 106 S. Easton Road, for painting and a sign.** The Design Committee recommended approval to the EDTF of the application. However, the application for Design Challenge Grant was incomplete. Upon motion by Mr. Cohen, the work was approved, however, no Design Challenge Grant funds were approved at this time.

**DCGP #10-07, The Roberts Block, 2 Roberts Block, for painting.** The Design Committee recommended approval to the EDTF of the application and the request for Design Challenge Grant funding in an amount of \$5,000. Upon motion by Mr. Cohen, the work and funding request were unanimously accepted by the EDTF.

**DCGP #10-11, The Game Junkie, 111 S. Easton Road, for a sign.** The Design Committee recommended to the EDTF approval of the COA of the proposed sign and the request for Design Challenge Grant funding in the amount of \$2,186.25. Upon motion by Mr. Cohen to approve the application for funding and a COA, the recommendations were unanimously accepted by the EDTF.

Discussion ensued about the Township's façade enhancement guidelines and if the procedures and policies permitted reimbursement of work on two facades, if the amount of requested reimbursement exceeded \$5,000 per given year. Ms. Shaw explained that she checked with DCED and the State would allow for this; however, the Township's guidelines would need to be amended. Mr. Cohen made a motion to recommend to the Public Affairs Committee consideration of modifications to the Cheltenham Township Design Challenge Grant Program Guidelines for building façade improvements to allow for additional definition of "facades" subject to DCED guidelines; the motion was seconded by Mr. Kratzer and unanimously approved.

Mr. Kratzer then reported that the Design Committee was asked to provide recommendations on behalf of the EDTF for waste and recycling containers for businesses in the Township and bike racks for the Township public buildings.

Following lengthy discussion, Mr. Kratzer made a motion that the EDTF recommend to the Public Affairs Committee to amend the Township's current recycling Ordinance to require any mercantile business within the commercial districts, where the public can purchase consumable products, or where the business sells to the general public consumable products, to provide and maintain waste and recycling containers on the business premises. The motion was unanimously accepted by the EDTF.

Mr. Kratzer then made a presentation on recommendations for bike rack selection and placement. Mr. Cohen made a motion to recommend to the Public Affairs Committee to: 1) support the need for bike racks at all Township public buildings and parks in the community. With respect to placement of bike racks in the commercial districts, the following recommendations were made: 2) support the design of the proposed new bike racks which hold up to four bikes and are estimated at \$1,000 for purchase and installation (see attached); 3) encourage outside plans for bike racks from (SEPTA) and 4) recommend educational signage for the existing bike racks in the Glenside area of the Easton Road streetscape. It was noted that the commercial district liaisons should assist the Township in determining the location and quantity of bike racks in each of the districts.

**B. Organization and Development** – Mr. Carboni was not present to offer a report.

**C. Economic Restructuring-** Mr. Milbert was not present to offer a report.

**D. Marketing and Promotions Committee –**

- District Liaison for Elkins Park East – Mr. David Cohen was not present to offer a report.

- District Liaison for Glenside - Ms. Haff was not present but did forward the Downtown Glenside Merchants' Association (DGMA) report. (see attached)
- District Liaison for E. Cheltenham Avenue – Ms. Helm was not present to offer a report.
- District Liaison for Cheltenham Village – No report as this position is currently vacant.
- District Liaison for Elkins Park West – Mr. Mirsky stated he had acquired additional e-mail addresses for businesses in the district and would e-mail them to Ms. Shaw.

**E. America in Bloom** – Ms. Williams reported that the planting of native perennial plants has been completed at the entrance signs for LaMott Community Center, Glenside Hall, Parkview and Tookany Creek Park. Ms. Williams and co-chair Ms. Weiner make weekly site visits. Ms. Williams stated that the four areas look beautiful and the community is expressing positive comments. The weather has presented some challenges and the watering of these areas is currently being provided by Parks and Recreation Department personnel on an as needed basis. Ms. Williams will provide photos to attach to the minutes.

**F. KoBaWoo Shopping Center and adjacent stores at Penrose and Cheltenham Avenues.** Ms. Marshall was not present to offer a report. However, Mr. Havar informed the members that he did hear from Mr. Schwam, the architect. Mr. Choe, property owner, was still not available due to travel plans. The other party, Mr. Yu was still interested in continuing the discussion.

**4. Chairman's Report** – Mr. Alan Cohen reported that he worked on EDTF matters and attended public meetings.

**5. Old Business** –

**A.** Mr. Havar stated that the Business Recruitment and Retention Plan has been completed and the final version is on the Township website. EDTF's district liaison chairs were asked to

review the plan over the summer and identify goals for next year to use as a project for discussion at the EDTF September meeting. Mr. Havar pointed out that the marketing brochures were finalized and are currently at the printer and should be available by the end of the month with digital copies available. A question arose as to why the Greater Cheltenham Avenue Business Improvement District (GCA BID) is not included as part of the Business Recruitment and Retention Plan marketing strategy. Mr. Havar noted that the GCA BID will be listed on the Township's website as a sixth Commercial District; however, he said it is not within the Township's Main Street Program.

Mr. Havar noted the Glenside BID Feasibility Study was presented and reviewed at the Public Works Committee meeting last week and the plan was recommended to the Board of Commissioners for acceptance. The schedule for public notification and a public hearing ordinance adoption later this fall will proceed as outlined in the plan.

**B.** Mr. Havar updated the EDTF on the status of the Commercial District Signage Project. The project is 99% complete, with a few change orders going back and forth. Mr. Cohen thought the signs looked terrific. Ms. Shaw also mentioned that she had also received good feedback on the signage from the business community.

**C.** The GCA BID Board reconvened on June 29, 2010 and held its second meeting on July 20, 2010 and the nine (9) incorporators comprised of business owners, non-profits and municipal representatives will serve one year terms. The GCA BID Executive Committee will be meeting monthly at the Cheltenham Square Mall. The BID Board Executive Committee members are Lori Stopyra, Chairman; Yitz Moller, Vice Chairman; John Unger, Treasurer. The Secretary position is still open. Commissioner Art Haywood is representing the Township at these meetings. The BID Board approved the job description for BID Executive Director at today's meeting and the BID Board will first solicit interested parties who are out of work and then after three weeks advertise

publically. Expected revenue generation is \$400,000 if all businesses remit the assessed fees. Mr. Havar also reported that the BID Board discussed cleanup plans for 19<sup>th</sup>/Penrose/Cheltenham Avenue as well as perennial plantings.

D. Mr. Havar stated that the plans for the LaMott Pedestrian Streetlights were let to bid. A pre-bid meeting is scheduled for July 23, 2010. It is anticipated to award a contract next month.

E. Mr. Havar updated the EDTF on the Willow Avenue Streetscape and Roadway Construction Project. The Montgomery County Staff tentatively approved \$500,000 as part of the CBDG program. The County Board of Commissioners is scheduled to vote on it at their meeting on July 30, 2010. The decision on the grant application of \$469,000 from the Montgomery County Revitalization Program has been postponed. A decision will be made in the fall on the Elm Street grant application.

F. The Easton Road Streetscape Improvements Phase III design package was submitted to PennDOT District 6 on July 15, 2010. Once PennDOT approves the design package, DVRPC can request funding from the federal government to obligate the Township's \$1.4 million grant request from the federal government to pay for the project. When funds are secured, PennDOT will allow the Township to bid the project in the fall. Arcadia University has signed new access agreements to address the new design issues affecting the driveways as a result of the recent ADA requirements being amended.

6. *New Business* - None

7. *Main Street Manager Report* – Ms. Shaw mentioned First Fridays in the Downtown Glenside Commercial District; the EMCCC Business Expo slated for October from 5-7 p.m. at Salus University; interest for two new restaurants – at the former Rizzo's restaurant and the former Elkins Park Pharmacy – a food co-op.


**8. Assistant Township Manager Report**

- Mr. Havir reviewed Montgomery County's "Town Center News" quarterly newsletter encouraging compact, mixed use development. Mr. Havir felt that the report was worthwhile and recommended it be turned over to the ad hoc zoning committee. - Mr. Havir reported he is working on a Request for Proposal (RFP) for consultant design services for the Elkins Park West Streetscape and it should be completed later this fall.
- Mr. Havir reported that PennDOT just announced the next application round of the PCT1 grant funding is due September 15, 2010. The EDTF unanimously concurred with Mr. Havir's suggestion to use the funding opportunity and apply for money for the Elkins Park East Streetscape Project since these plans have been completed with respect to engineering and design.

**9. Citizens' Forum**

Mr. Kratzer inquired about the matter of the trees being cut down along the SEPTA-owned Elkins Park Train Station and tracks near Park and Montgomery Avenues. Mr. Havir stated that Township Administration has written letters to SEPTA and PECO Energy regarding this matter.

**10. Adjournment:** The meeting adjourned at 9:38 p.m.

#### TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

##### Design Challenge Grant Program Applications:

- **DCGP #10-12, Pita Pocket, 582 Township Line Road, for a sign**  
This sign is a replacement face for an existing cabinet box. The applicant created the opaque sign to comply with the zoning code. There are two 'sets' of food shown on the sign and the Committee recommended taking one set off, but the applicant said the sign seemed unbalanced that way. This application does not need zoning. The Committee made the following recommendations: add gooseneck exterior lighting above the sign; clean up the olive oil bottles so they look more like olive oil bottles. Upon receipt of a business license number, this application is recommended for approval to the Economic Development Task Force for \$392.20, half of the project cost as well as for a Certificate of Appropriateness.
- **DCGP #10-13, State Farm, 12 E. Glenside Avenue, for an awning sign**  
This application is for an awning sign. The awning does not cover an existing transom window, as that transom was painted over. The sign is corporate and in good taste and meets the zoning code per the Zoning Officer. Pending verification that the awning will be made of fabric and not hard plastic, this application will be recommended for approval to the EDTF for ..... Half of the project cost as well as for a COA.
- **DCGP #10-14, Humphreys, 100 S. Easton Road, for painting**  
This application is for painting and does not need zoning. As the color is the same as what is on the building currently but will refresh the look of the building, this application is recommended for approval to the EDTF \$1750, half of the project cost.

- **DCGP #10-15, Stitches' Dream, 219 S. Easton Road, for a sign**  
This is an application for a freestanding sign, replacing a current sign. The sign meets zoning per the Zoning Officer. The Committee liked the sign and made the following recommendations: the posts should be painted white with the ball caps in gold. The ground lighting costs can be included in the proposal and so this reimbursement will wait until those costs are included. The sign will be recommended for a COA and approval to the EDTF for \$925 or half the project cost of this sign.
- **DCGP #10-16, The Blue Comet, 106 S. Easton Road, for painting and a sign**  
The applicant will repaint and freshen his sign for this existing building. Colors are the same and there are no zoning issues. The Committee is in favor of this application and will recommend approval to the EDTF for half of the project cost or \$..... as well as for a COA.

#### Old Business

- **DCGP #10-07, The Roberts Block, Roberts Block, painting**  
This application reflects much work being done on this building to improve its cosmetic appearance, as well as putting on a new roof. The Committee reviewed the proposals which include woodwork and surface cleaning and preparation, exterior cleanup, graffiti removal and painting of 75 plywood pieces being used to protect the windows while awaiting restoration. The committee is in favor of these improvements and recommends approval to the EDTF of the requested \$5,000, less than half of the project cost, but the maximum allowable reimbursement.
- **DCGP #10-11, The Game Junkie, 111 S. Easton Road, for a sign**  
This sign is encouraged by the Committee as it is channel letters, not blocking an architectural element of the building, a handsome transom. The sign meets zoning per the Zoning Officer. This sign is recommended for approval to the EDTF and for a COA, as well as for \$2186.25, half of the project cost.

#### New Business

- Discussion regarding bike racks in the commercial districts - tabled
- Discussion regarding recycling containers at convenience stores – tabled.

## **Downtown Glenside Merchants Association (DGMA)**

**Glenside, Pub**

**Wednesday, July 7, 2010**

Attendees: Jim Bell, Resident; Drusilla Buscemi, Arcadia University; Kim Ngov, Jasmine; Barbara Nye, Greater Glenside Chamber of Commerce; Carol Ragin, Stitchers' Dream; Fay Sewell, Serenity Gifts and Coffee and Ruth Littner Shaw, Cheltenham Township Main Street.

Fay Sewell moved and Kim Ngov seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the meeting of May 5, 2010. The minutes were approved by acclamation.

### **DGMA Report**

- **Street Fair:** Ruth Littner Shaw suggested that two more committees be established for this year's Annual Glenside Street Fair, one for vendors and another for site/logistics. To date, Nancy Bowers is chairing the Children's Corner, Rob Carachilo is chairing Entertainment and Lisa Rittler is chairing Food. Those in attendance agreed with Ruth's suggestion and recommended Ruth Littner Shaw and Maureen Haff for the Vendors Committee and Rob Carachilo for a combined Entertainment/Site/Logistics Committee. Attendees learned that there would be two stages at this year's fair, one for music at Glenside Avenue and Easton Road and another at Waverly Road and Easton Road for cultural events linked to this year's theme for a fair with an international flair. The group supported the idea of placing lawn signs in the business district and on the lawns of supportive residents to advertise the fair several weeks before the event. Information is being gathered to determine the format, number, cost and locations for the signs. The goal is to order the signs in the first half of August. Ruth Littner Shaw noted that information on most aspects of DGMA's activities and events was being sent to the full DGMA email list and suggested that an email be sent to those on the list advising that members and supporters could choose to opt out of receiving emails on the day-to-day details of event planning and still receive routine news on upcoming activities and events. Attendees agreed. (Jim Bell sent out the opt-out email the following day.) Attendees noted that DGMA was exploring the possibility of closing Glenside Avenue to vehicular traffic during the fair. All were aware of the difficulties in taking that step. (The township's Marketing and Promotions Committee has since advised that it is in favor of the idea for the 2011 street fair and recommends that research begin in January 2011.)

## Meeting Minutes of the July 7, 2010 DGMA

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- **Fundraising:** Jim Bell provided an up-date on fundraising activities under way. He reported that those activities were ongoing under the leadership of Kathy Phillips and Paul Gordon. They have been staffing a DGMA information booth at the Glenside Farmers' Market once a month, chairing bake sales and checking on donation jars in members' shops and businesses. They've also been active in community outreach. Ruth Littner Shaw has made copies of a fundraising letter. With the help of DGMA volunteers Kathy and Paul will get these letters out to potential supporters and continue to seek innovative ways to get DGMA the financial support it needs to keep its activities and events going in support of a vibrant Downtown Glenside. Today DGMA is current on all of its obligations and is working to secure seed money for upcoming activities and events. (Please donate and volunteer!)
- **First Fridays:** Attendees settled on the themes for the final three months of 2010. The theme for October is *Glenside Goes Global!* in support of the international flair planned for this year's fair. October's First Friday is the evening before the fair. The theme for November is *Giving Thanks!* for the many blessings, big and small, that have come to the Glenside Community in 2010. The theme for December is *WinterFest!* for the First Friday of that month and the big holiday party that will be held at Wesley Place the following day. Attendees supported an idea from Fay Sewell to have little maps showing the location of all association members participating in First Friday events available for customers visiting their shops, restaurants and service businesses. All agreed that the maps would help visitors move from business to business and take advantage of all the special offers. Ruth Littner Shaw agreed to make up and print some maps for the First Friday in August.
- **Good News:** The group took a look at the growing list of good things that have happened in Downtown Glenside in recent months: A new business downtown (Classic Game Junkie), a returning business (Blue Comet), upgrades to downtown buildings (The Glenside Pub, Blue Comet, Humphreys and the Glenside SEPTA Station), an imaginative plan for the reuse of a classic building (Artisan Station at Glenside in the Roberts Block building), new directional signs around the town, thriving plants hanging along Easton Road and placed in planters along Glenside Avenue, DGMA's monthly presence at the Glenside Farmers' Market and its filling donation jars, posters and informational materials placed in participating businesses in support of DGMA and Downtown Glenside.

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- The BID: Ruth Littner Shaw advised the group that the feasibility of a Business Improvement District in Downtown Glenside was moving forward. She noted that the final report on the study would call for a smaller BID area and laddered millage and would not initially call for a full-time director. Ruth also reported that the Greater Cheltenham Avenue BID was moving forward. (The Township announced the final presentation of the Glenside feasibility study for 7:00 PM on Wednesday, July 14, 2010 at the Public Works Committee Meeting at the Township Administration Building.)

#### **Commissioner's Report**

No formal report. Drew Sharkey was unable to attend the meeting.

#### **Main Street Manager's Report**

Ruth Littner Shaw shared information and recommendations during the meeting. Please see her comments in the paragraphs above.

#### **Chamber of Commerce Report**

Barbara Nye provided an update on the Annual Glenside Auto Show that is coming up on Saturday, August 7, 2010. She reported that the banner for the event was up and requested DGMA members to volunteer for the event if at all possible. Barbara also noted that the gathering point for volunteers had been moved from the law offices at the corner of Easton Road and Royal Avenue to Hibbert's at 142 S. Easton Road in the middle of Downtown Glenside.
