

The regular meeting of the Twinning Committee was held tonight, Chairman James McCann, III, presiding. Members present were Penny Geikler, Dorothy Spruill and Mary Washington. Staff present was Nancy K. Gibson, Public Information Officer.

1. Upon motion of Ms. Geikler, and approved by committee, the minutes of the September 11, 2013, meeting were accepted.

2. Under **2013 Lottery Report**, Mr. McCann reported four winners in September for a total payout of \$100. Ms Gibson added that the application for a 2014 license for a Small Game of Chance has been submitted to the county and that quotes for printing the 2014 lottery tickets are due by this Friday. The tickets must feature the license number. She anticipates distributing the tickets at the November meeting.

3. Under *Project Reports*, the following items were discussed:

A. **Cheltenham UK Videos:** Ms. Washington reported delivering her video copies to the Old York Road Historical Society (OYRHS) and Cheltenham Township Historical Commission. Mr. McCann received a thank you letter from OYRHS. Mr. McCann reported delivering his video to the librarian in Cheltenham High School. Ms. Gibson reported that she submitted the “Cheltenham: Center for the Cotswolds” video to Cheltenham High School for duplication. Members requested a press release announcing the availability of the videos after the second video is distributed.

B. **Twining Archive:** Mr. Chambres emailed a draft form for tracking archival items (see attached). Ms. Gibson circulated a list created by former member Andrea White of items to be archived (see attached). Ms. Washington will develop a list of archival material needed to create an archive, which will be housed in the third floor of the Richard Wall House Museum.

C. Exchanges:

iv. School Students: Mr. McCann report that his daughter, who is a seventh-grade teacher at Ancillae-Assumpta Academy, received permission from the vice principal to establish a link for either one seventh-grade class (approximately 20 students) or the entire grade (approximately 70 students). Ms. Gibson will contact Ms. Wight to try to locate appropriate UK students for the exchange.

4. There were no items under Old Business.

5. Under New Business, Ms. Gibson asked members if they wanted to host a table at the Community Harvest Festival on Saturday, Oct. 12 from noon until 5:00 p.m. Ms. Geikler was willing but didn't want to be alone. Since no other members present were available, the possibility of a combined Historical Commission/Twinning Committee table was discussed. Ms. Washington will follow up on the possibility of a combined table and will pick up the Twinning material from Ms. Gibson's office if the idea is approved.

6. There being no further business, upon motion of Ms. Washington, and approved by Committee, the meeting was adjourned.
