

The regular meeting of the Twinning Committee was held tonight, Chairman James McCann presiding. Members present were William Chambres, Dorothy Spruill and Mary Washington.

1. Upon motion of Mr. Chambres, and approved by committee, the minutes of the September 1, 2010, meeting were accepted.

2. Mr. McCann reported three lottery winners in September for a total payout of \$75. He added that the application for the license to continue the lottery in 2011 has been mailed to the county. Printing the lottery tickets is pending the receipt of the license.

3. Under **Project Reports**, the following items were discussed:

A. Exchanges:

i. **Gym Link:** The committee reviewed The Gym's proposed logo for this year's fitness exchange. Upon motion of Mr. Chambres, and approved by committee, the logo was accepted. Mr. McCann reported that as of now, the two teams were close in their percentages of weight loss.

ii. **Scouts:** Mr. McCann shared a letter from the scout master in Cheltenham UK, which discussed gifts to the Cheltenham US troop and other items of goodwill.

iii. **Rotary Link:** Ms. Washington reported that she has not been able to reach her son to obtain information concerning Cheltenham UK rotary organizations. However she will continue to try.

B. Community Events: Mr. McCann thanked Andrea White and Penny Geikler who with Mr. McCann staffed a Twinning Table at Market Day, where the Twinning banner was displayed. The general opinion was that the public was interested in the endeavor. Ms. White has indicated that she may be able to attend the Community Harvest Festival on October 9 to staff a Twinning Table.

C. **Fingerpost:** Since the last meeting, Mr. McCann learned the wording of the finial could be changed without incurring additional cost. Members reviewed artwork depicting the original wording of the UK finial “Cheltenham Twin Towns” and an alternate wording “Twin Town & Other Cheltenhams” suggested by Ms. Gibson since the US post features many communities named Cheltenham that are not twins of Cheltenham US. The committee preferred “Cheltenham” at the top since the post will be located in Cheltenham US and thought “Official Twin” was sufficient to distinguish our special relationship with Cheltenham UK. Upon motion of Ms. Washington, and approved by committee, the committee decided to retain the wording as it appeared on the Cheltenham UK post. Mr. McCann advised that the colors selected for the post were from Sherman Williams, which is not available in the UK. After much research and telephoning, Mr. McCann was able to send color chips to the UK so the post coloring will conform with US historical signage. Members expressed their appreciation to Mr. McCann for the tremendous time and work he has expended for this effort.

4. There was no *Old Business*.

5. Under *New Business*, the following items were discussed:

A. Ms. Spruill suggested sending a fingerpost announcement to Bobby Oliver of the *Philadelphia Inquirer* who recently wrote an interesting article concerning the twinning of Evesham US and Evesham UK. Mr. Chambres thought the committee should host a press conference on the occasion of the dedication of the fingerpost, which was unanimously approved. The event could feature English-style food in the Township boardroom. Ms. Spruill suggested that all the Cheltenham towns on the fingerpost be invited to attend. Further discussion will be featured on next month’s agenda.

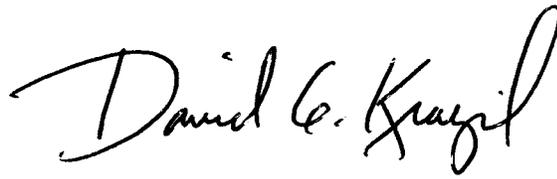

D. Upon motion of Ms. Washington, and approved by committee, the Twinning display at the Wall House will be moved to the Carriage House for easier viewing by the public, if the curator consented. Ms. Spruill, the curator, agreed.

6. There being no further business, upon motion of Mr. Chambres, and approved by committee, the meeting was adjourned.
